

# Catamount – Area Attractions

While staying at Catamount you may want to take day trips to experience many other assets of the region. Below is a list of places and local attractions within about 50-60 miles that might interest you.

There also are many other things to see and do along the highways and byways and in the small communities of Northern New York—doing sports activities, antiquing, visiting museums, and buying local products including arts, crafts, and even Amish-made baskets, quilts, and much more.

## Blue Mountain Lake – 60 miles

Adirondack Museum and Museum Library

## Canton – 26 miles

St. Lawrence County (SLC) government offices; St. Lawrence University including Brewer Bookstore; SUNY Canton; SLC Historical Association and Silas Wright Museum; Traditional Arts in Upstate New York (TAUNY) gallery and shop; Shops along Main Street; Restaurants (e.g., McCarthy's, Sergi's Italian Restaurant, Josie's Pizzeria, Phoebe's, University Inn, etc.)

## Childwold (including hamlet in Town of Piercefield) – 8 to 13 miles

The Backwoods Inn (on State Highway 56); Thirsty Moose Restaurant and Bar (on Route 3); Leather Artisan—artisan and shop (on Route 3); Mount Arab with Fire Tower (nearby with trailhead on Conifer Road)

## Colton (including hamlet of South Colton) – 8 to 15 miles

Higley Flow State Park / Nature Center; Raquette River Reservoirs; Stone Valley Hiking Trail; Sunday Rock Landmark; Boyce's General Store; Adirondack Artisans; Three Falls Antiques; Restaurants (e.g., The Hide Away, Sunday Rock Coffee Shop, South of the Rock Inn)

## Cranberry Lake – 18 miles

Cranberry Lake / Marinas (fish, paddle, boat, and snowmobile depending on the season); Five Ponds Wilderness Area (northern edge); Diners and Restaurants

## Heuvelton – 48 miles

Pickens General Store (hand-crafted Amish goods and gifts); seasonal roadside stands (baskets, etc.) along way on County Route 10 and elsewhere

Lake Placid (in Lakes & High Peaks Regions of the Adirondacks) – 55 miles

Olympic Village—Center, Museum, Jumping and Sports Complexes; Ski areas (downhill and cross-country); Lake Placid; Mirror Lake; Uihlein Sugar Maple Station; nearby winter sports and other attractions (e.g., Santa's Workshop at North Pole) at White Face Mountain; Shops (e.g., Adirondack Store) and Restaurants

Massena – 42 miles

St. Lawrence Seaway and Power Project; Robert Moses State Park / Nature Center (Barnhart Island); Fishing charter boats (muskie); Akwesasne Cultural Center and Mohawk Casino (nearby in Hogansburg)

Ogdensburg – 40 miles

Frederic Remington Art Museum; St. Lawrence River and nearby Thousand Islands attractions (e.g., Boldt and Singer Castles); Historic sites (e.g., Fort La Presentation); Ogdensburg-Prescott International Bridge to Canada; Restaurants (e.g., Stone Fence)

Paul Smiths – 53 miles

Paul Smiths College; Adirondack Park Agency Visitor Interpretive Center

Potsdam – 22 miles

Clarkson University; SUNY Potsdam; Sun-Feather Natural Soap Company; Shopping (e.g., Hacketts, etc.), Grocery Stores, Diners (e.g., Fields Coffee House, Village Diner) and Restaurants (e.g., Angelo's, Sergi's, Cactus Grill and Cantina, Mama Lucia's, First Crush, and more)

Ray Brook – 51 miles

New York State Adirondack Park Agency (APA) Headquarters

Saranac Lake (in Lakes Region of the Adirondacks) – 47 miles

Saranac Lake; Hotel Saranac of Paul Smiths College; Winter Carnival (end of January / beginning of February); Adirondack Scenic Railroad; Golf (including Saranac Lake Golf Club plus Saranac Inn Golf & Country Club)

Tupper Lake (in Lakes Region of the Adirondacks) – 25 miles

Wild Center / Natural History Museum of the Adirondacks; Fernow Forest (Self-Guided Nature Trail); Municipal Golf Course; Groceries and Restaurants

Wanakena – 26 miles
